PARKS UNDERDOWN, SR., DIES

Founder of Hickory Springs Dead at Age 78



PARKS CORNELIUS UNDERDOWN, SR., who founded Hickory Springs Manufacturing Company died on May 3, 1981 after a brief illness. He was 78.

Mr. Underdown, known affectionately to his employees as "Parky," was an inspiration and a driving force up to the very end. A familiar sight, three days each week, was his arriving at work at 8:00 A.M. by taxi from his home in Lenoir. He followed his schedule although he had suffered several heart attacks and bouts with cancer and diabetes that had left him blind.

Mr. Underdown was founder of Hickory Springs, and co-founder of Snyder Paper Company. At the time of his death, he was Chairman of the Board of Hickory Springs, a director of Snyder Paper and President of Lenoir Pad and Paper Company.

Survivors include his wife, Hazel Teague Underdown; a son, Parks C. ("Neil") Underdown, Jr.; a daughter, Dorothy (Mrs. R. R.) Simmons; a brother, C. A. Underdown; and nine grandchildren.

The funeral was held Wednesday, May 6, at 2:00 P.M. at the First Presbyterian Church in Lenoir, N.C. Burial was at Blue Ridge Memorial Park in Lenoir.

HI-CO NEWS extends its deepest sympathy to his family and many friends across the country. "Parky" was a giant of a man and will be sorely missed by all who knew him.


Perfect Attendance Honored at Many Locations

After the ambulance arrived, he tried to go about his business stocking groceries, but began to




worry about the child. He went to the hospital where the child was being treated. The child was later released to return home with his parents.






